The OSCAR project has reached another important milestone with the official launch of the OSCAR Digital Training Platform. Young people, youth trainers and organisations can now access a complete multilingual learning environment dedicated to responsible electronic waste management.

At the same time, the OSCAR Youth Competition has successfully concluded. After a creative competition involving participants from all partner countries, one national winner has been selected in each country.

The OSCAR Digital Training Platform is now fully operational, providing free multilingual access to educational resources that help young people better understand electronic waste and adopt more sustainable behaviours.

The platform has been designed to make learning engaging, interactive and accessible for everyone interested in responsible e-waste management. It offers learning materials in English, French, Spanish, Greek, and Estonian together with assessments and certificates.

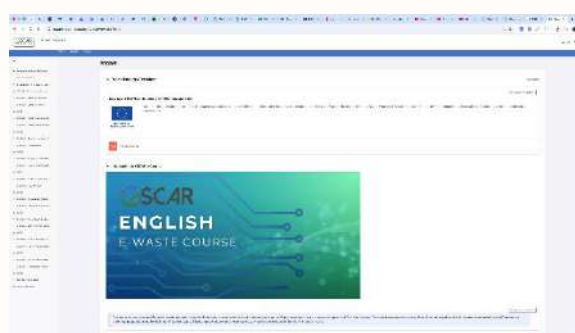

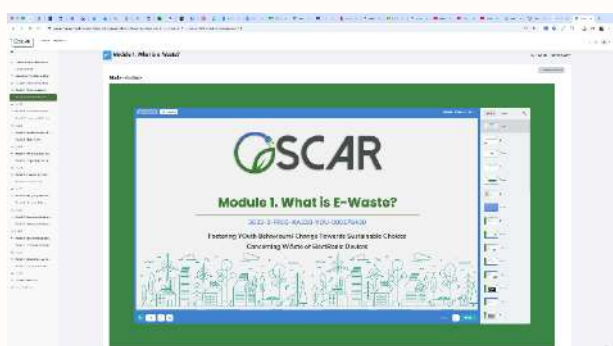
Course Structure

Learners can explore a complete training programme covering topics such as:

- What is E-Waste?
- The Environmental Impact of E-Waste
- Health risks from E-Waste mismanagement
- Proper Disposal Methods of E-Waste
- E-waste Laws and Regulations
- Upcycling and Reusing Electronics
- Recycling E-Waste: Why It matters?
- Role of Manufacturers in E-Waste Reduction
- Responsible Youth Habits



The modular structure allows learners to progress at their own pace while gaining practical knowledge they can immediately apply in everyday life.

The OSCAR Youth Competition invited young people aged 15-30 from France, Greece, Malta, Spain and Estonia to develop creative ideas encouraging responsible e-waste management through posters, leaflets and short videos.

The submitted projects showed how young people can become active ambassadors for behavioural change within their communities.

National Winners Selected

Following the national evaluation process, one winner has been selected in each partner country.

These five young representatives will now travel to Estonia to participate in the OSCAR Final Conference, where they will:

- present their winning ideas;
- exchange experiences with participants from across Europe;
- compete for the overall OSCAR Youth Competition Award.

- smart watches

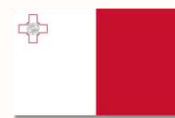
These products contain valuable raw materials that can be recovered through proper recycling, helping reduce environmental impacts and supporting the circular economy.
